RULES, INSTRUCTIONS, & INFORMATION FOR THE IDAHO TRUCK DRIVING CHAMPIONSHIPS



SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

All drivers MUST be present for the Written Test & Welcome and Introduction starting at 7:30 AM. Drivers who are not present will not be eligible to compete.

Drivers are encouraged to spend time with their families, except when they are called to compete in their respective class events.

Call to Tent: Prior to their course competition, drivers will be called to the designated driver tent by class group (i.e. 3-axle, twins).

Sequestration: Once called, drivers must remain in the driver tent until they complete their course run. The duration of this time is dependent on the number of competitors in their class. Once drivers complete their course, they may return to their company area.

Observation of Other Classes: While in the tent drivers are not permitted to observe their class compete on the course.

Attendance Requirement: Announcements will be made to call classes have been called to the driver tent. Our announcer will make these announcements from the stage area by the P.A. system. Make sure someone from your company can hear the announcements. Drivers can also keep aware of the class that is on the course and use the run order to know which class is next in line. Ultimately, drivers are responsible for staying informed. There are no fixed scheduled times; participation is based on the completion of each group's activities. If drivers are not available when their turn arrives, they may face disqualification from the competition.

Pre-Trip Event: Similarly, drivers must be present in the driver tent before their scheduled pre-trip Inspection. Drivers are not permitted to discuss the pre-trip inspection or the course with other drivers.

These rules are implemented to ensure the smooth operation of the competition, uphold fairness among all participants and to ensure an enjoyable experience for everyone involved.

DRIVER REGISTRATION

Companies are required to supply <u>1</u> Volunteer for every <u>3</u> drivers that they register to compete. Failure to supply volunteers will result in disqualification. Volunteers must be registered and must check in at the event. See below for Volunteers.

DRIVER REGISTRATION - DEADLINE: March 28, 2025

The **required supporting forms** and documents must be submitted to ITA by the close of business on March 31, 2025. These forms and documents include the:

- (1) ATA/ITA Driver Entry Form
- (2) Current Motor Vehicle Record (MVR);
- (3) CDL/driver's license with proper endorsements
- (4) Driver photo.
- (5) Signed ITA waiver

COMPLETING DRIVER REGISTRATION:

All competitors must register using ITA's registration forms and submit additional forms and documents.

Current MVR – Must be pulled after February 20, 2025, and show that the driver's medical certificate is valid.

CDL copy – The driver must have the proper endorsements for the class entered.

If a driver's CDL or medical card expires by April 5, 2025, a new license or medical card must be provided by April 5, 2025, before they are eligible to compete.

Driver photo – Please send a clear head shot photo of the driver. License photo is fine – $\underline{\mathit{IF}}$ it is legible.

Step Three: Submit entry fees. Entry fee is \$150 per driver. Entries after March 28 will be \$175. No entries accepted after March 31. Drivers' Company will be invoiced. Invoices can be paid by card online, or mail in check. Payments made by credit card will include a **credit card fee of \$4.64**. To avoid this fee, please mail a check.

COMPETITOR ELIGIBILITY

COMPETING DRIVERS MUST:

- Be based or licensed in Idaho and in a driving position with their current employer since August 20, 2024. (some exemptions may apply)
- Perform a minimum of 1,200 hours annually as a professional truck driver.
- Have the proper license endorsement for the class of participation chosen.
- Have an accident-free driving record since August 20, 2024.
- Drivers with non-preventable crashes may be eligible to compete.
- Documentation must be submitted to the IDTDC Planning Committee by April 1, 2025, for all non-preventable crashes (including non-DOT recordable) for review.
- Have not been away from the regular driving duties beyond an aggregate of 30 calendar days since August 20, 2024.

Drivers compete in one of the following classes:

Step Van - Straight Truck - Flatbed - Sleeper - Twins - Tanker - 3 Axle - 4 Axle - 5 Axle

No class or driver changes will be accepted after April 1, 2025, including onsite.

Competitors should be in company identifying clothing and wear the name badge provided during check-in.

Welcome & Instructions

All Drivers will report to the classroom for the written test at 7:30am. When they have completed the test, they will exit the classroom and wait for all drivers to complete the test. Then they will gather again in the classroom at 8:30 AM for the course instruction & slide show.

Skills Course

The skills course walk will commence at **8:45 AM**. The course walk will be no more than 10 minutes, and drivers may not ask questions during the course walk. Drivers may not pace the course or measure the distance between problems or equipment. The use or possession of phones, smart watches, or pedometers is strictly prohibited and will result in disqualification. Discussion of the skills course or pre-trip details with other drivers is strictly prohibited until all drivers have completed the event activities.

WRITTEN TEST

Drivers do not need to bring anything for the written test and should not sit next to other competitors from their own company. Test is 40 questions, and drivers have one hour to complete it. Cell phones, smartwatches, or other prohibited devices must be left with a family member or in your car.

FACTS FOR DRIVERS

PRE-TRIP INSPECTION

Drivers will not be provided with any tools. You must clearly announce any defects found, and what the defect is. You will Not be told if you are correct. You will not be penalized for naming defects that are not part of the competition. Time Limits are based on vehicle Class.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Participation in all ITA hosted events is subject to the observance of the ITA's rules and procedures. The activities outlined below are **strictly prohibited**. Any participant, volunteer, or staff member who violates this Code is subject to removal from the 2025 ITA TDC activities and possible future ITA-hosted events.

- Cheating, use of cell phones, sharing of competition information for the purpose of gaining or giving an unfair advantage.
- **SMOKING**, possession or use of alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs within the POST Facility is strictly forbidden.
- Disrespectful behavior, including abusive language, rudeness, harassment (verbal, physical, or visual), violence, or conduct endangering the well-being of others, towards staff members, volunteers, or participants.
- Bullying or taking unfair advantage of any participant.
- Failing to cooperate with TDC leaders or ITA staff.

COMPANY INFORMATION

REGISTRATION:

Companies will be invoiced for their driver entries. Supervisor signatures are required on all registration forms, verifying the Driver is eligible to compete.

EVENT REFUND POLICY:

Cancellations prior to March 18, 2025 are eligible for a refund, less a 5% transaction fee.

Cancellations after March 18, 2025 are **not** eligible for a refund.

Cancellations can be transferred to another driver within the same company.

CLASS WINNERS

The Winning employer company must be a member of the Idaho Trucking Association (ITA) and provide the National Truck Driving Championship (NTDC) Entry Fee (\$450) in order for the winning driver to be sent to nationals. Winning companies will be invoiced for the NTDC entry fee for submitted competitors.

All invoices must be paid by May 15, 2025, for NTDC entry.

Winners that are involved in a disqualifying event after the Idaho TDC, or are unable to go to NTDC will surrender their spot to the second place winner.

TAILGATE SET UP

Companies may request a location for a tailgate set up. Spaces will be 12x12, unless a larger space is requested. (20x20)

The ITA will not provide tents, tables or chairs. You may bring your own, or hire a local event rental vendor. You may want to contact Idaho Tent & Events, for your needs. www.idahotents.com 208-559-2771

Companies are encouraged to bring food or entertainment for driver families. Drivers will be provided a lunch from the food truck.

Tailgate Rules:

- Please keep pets at home.
- Do not stake tents on the grass.
- No smoking anywhere on ISP property
- Keep children in your sight.
- Please keep distractions away from the course (i.e. skateboards, balls etc.
- No littering. Please respect ISP rules so we can continue to use their facility.
- Do not enter the course, unless directed to do so, and only if wearing a safety vest.
